"Jesus Calls Forth Life From Death"

1 Kings 17:17-24; Ephesians 3:13-21; Luke 7:11-17

A large funeral procession carrying the only son of a widow is confronted by another large procession, Jesus and His followers. Death and Life meet face to face at the gate of the city (Luke 7:11–17). Filled with compassion, Jesus comes into direct contact with our mortality in order to overcome it. He touches the coffin and speaks His creative words of life, **"Young man, I say to you, arise."** Jesus does what is neither expected nor requested. For through Christ, God the Father **"is able to do far more abundantly than all we ask or think"** (Ephesians 3:14–21). Jesus bore our death in His body that we may share in His resurrection. Even as Elijah stretched himself out three times over the Zarephath woman's son (2 Kings 17:17–24), God stretched Himself out over us in the threefold application of His Name in the baptismal water, breathing new and everlasting life into us. **"To Him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, forever and ever. Amen."** **INVOCATION** (make the sign of the holy cross and say)
