# The Congregation at Prayer

For the week of *The Eleventh Sunday after Trinity*

**Sunday, August 23 through Saturday, August 29**

**“The Lord Lifts Up the Lowly”**

Genesis 4:1-15; 1 Corinthians 15:1-10; Luke 18:9-14

**“And the LORD had regard for Abel and his offering, but for Cain and his offering He had no regard”** (Genesis 4:1–15). Unlike Abel, Cain’s offering did not proceed from a heart that revered and trusted in the Lord. Thus, the lowly tax collector who prayed, **“God, be merciful to me, a sinner!”** was the one who went down to his house justified before God, not the respectable, outwardly righteous Pharisee who trusted in himself and his own good living (Luke 18:9–14). **“For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast”** (Ephesians 2:1–10). The one who penitently despairs of his own righteousness and relies completely on the atoning mercy of God in Christ is the one who is declared righteous. Christ died for our sins and rose again the third day (1 Corinthians 15:1–10). Therefore, **“everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted.”**

*The following suggestions are offered as an aid in developing the habit of praying for ourselves and others each week:*

**Friday:** For faithful preaching of the holy cross of our Lord Jesus Christ; for the spread of His knowledge throughout the whole world; for the persecuted and oppressed; for the sick and dying.

**Saturday:** For faithfulness to the end; for the renewal of those who are withering in the faith or have fallen away; for receptive hearts and minds to God’s Word on the Lord’s Day; for pastors as they prepare to administer and for people as they prepare to receive Christ’s holy gifts.

Almighty and Everlasting God, always more ready to hear than we to pray and to give more than we either desire or deserve, pour down upon us the abundance of Your mercy, forgiving those things of which our conscience is afraid and giving us those good things that we are not worthy to ask, except through the merits and mediation of Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

O Lord, look down from Heaven.
